3. Fabric Gift Bags

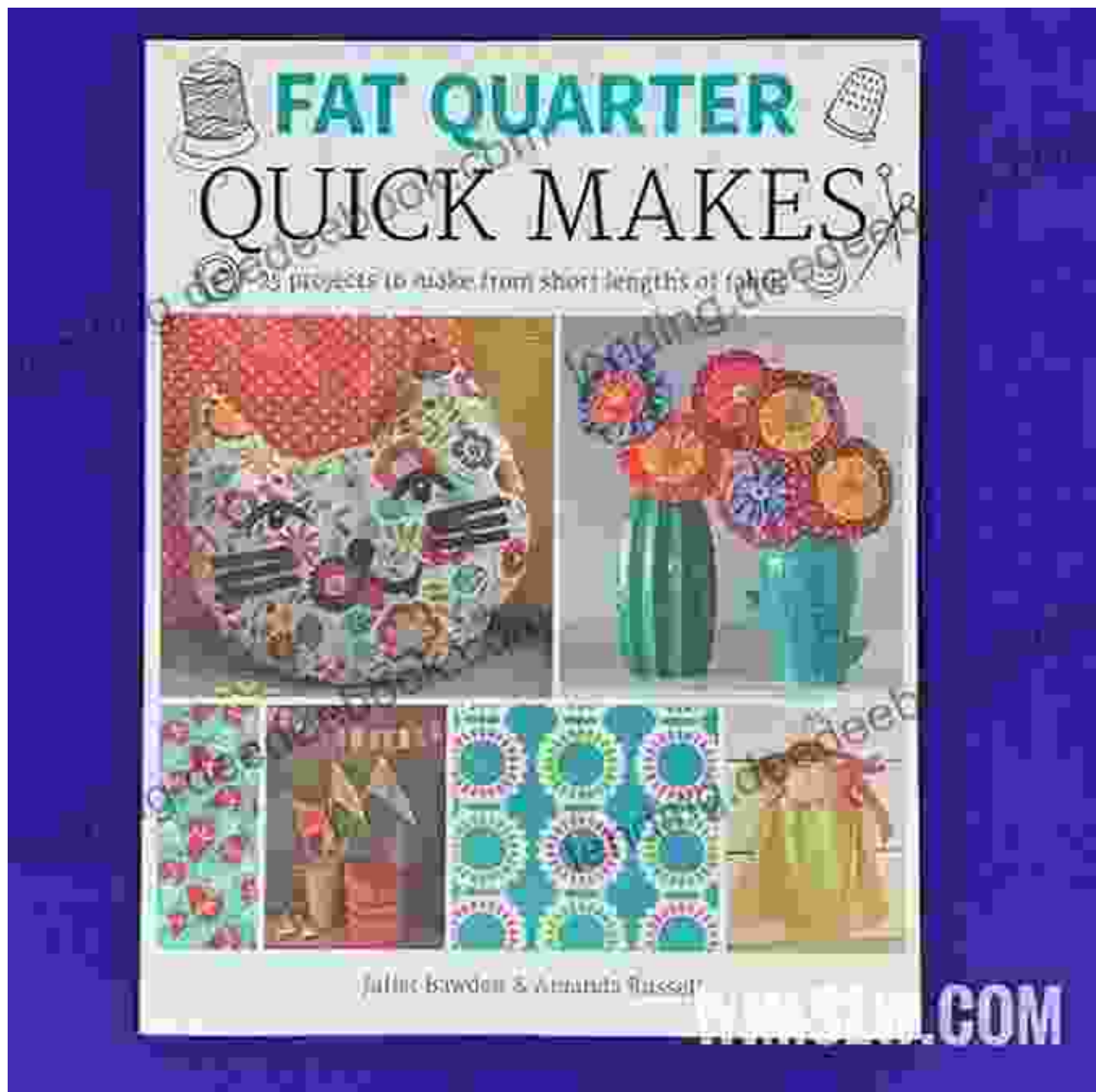

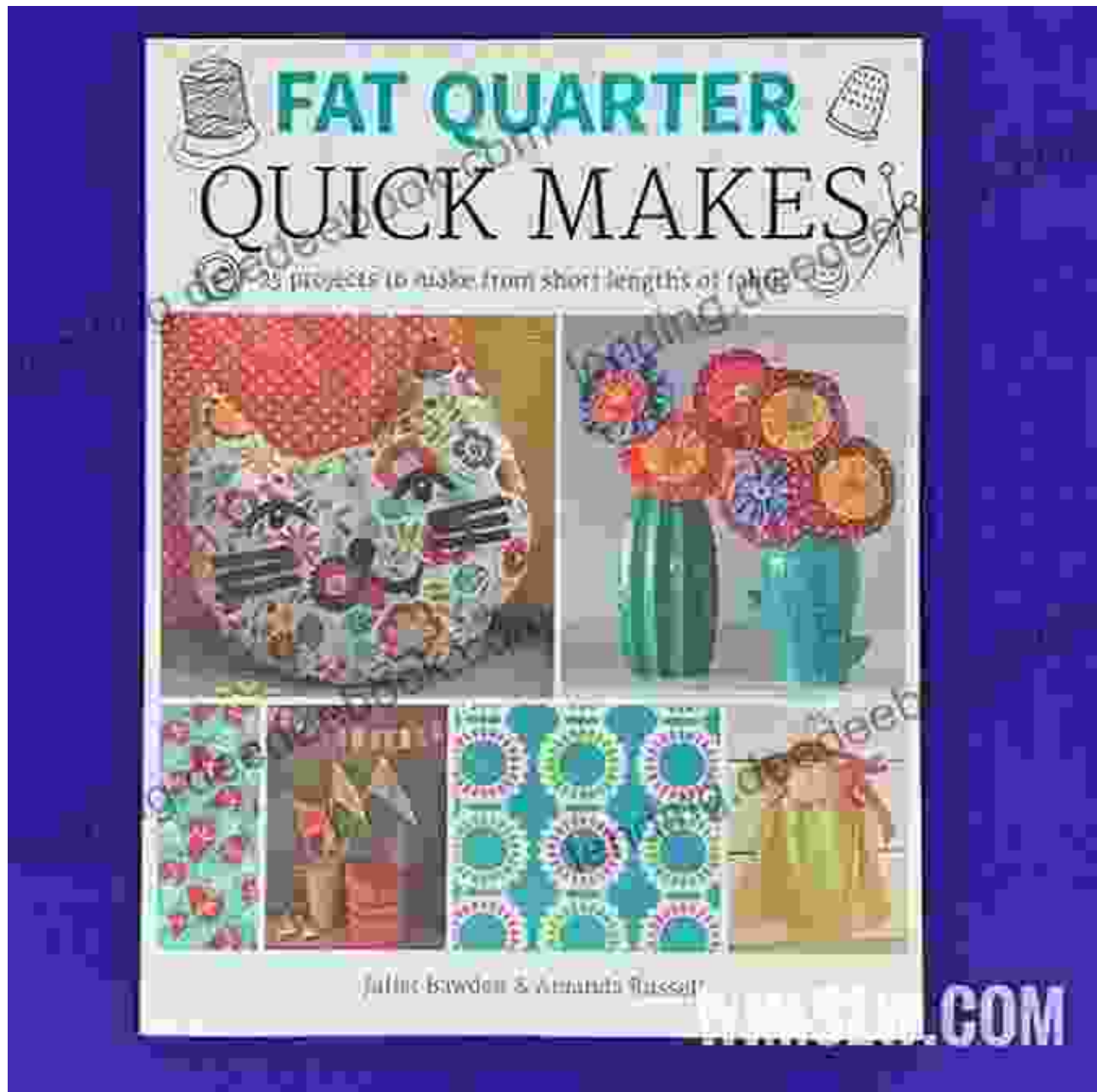
8. Fabric Potholders
