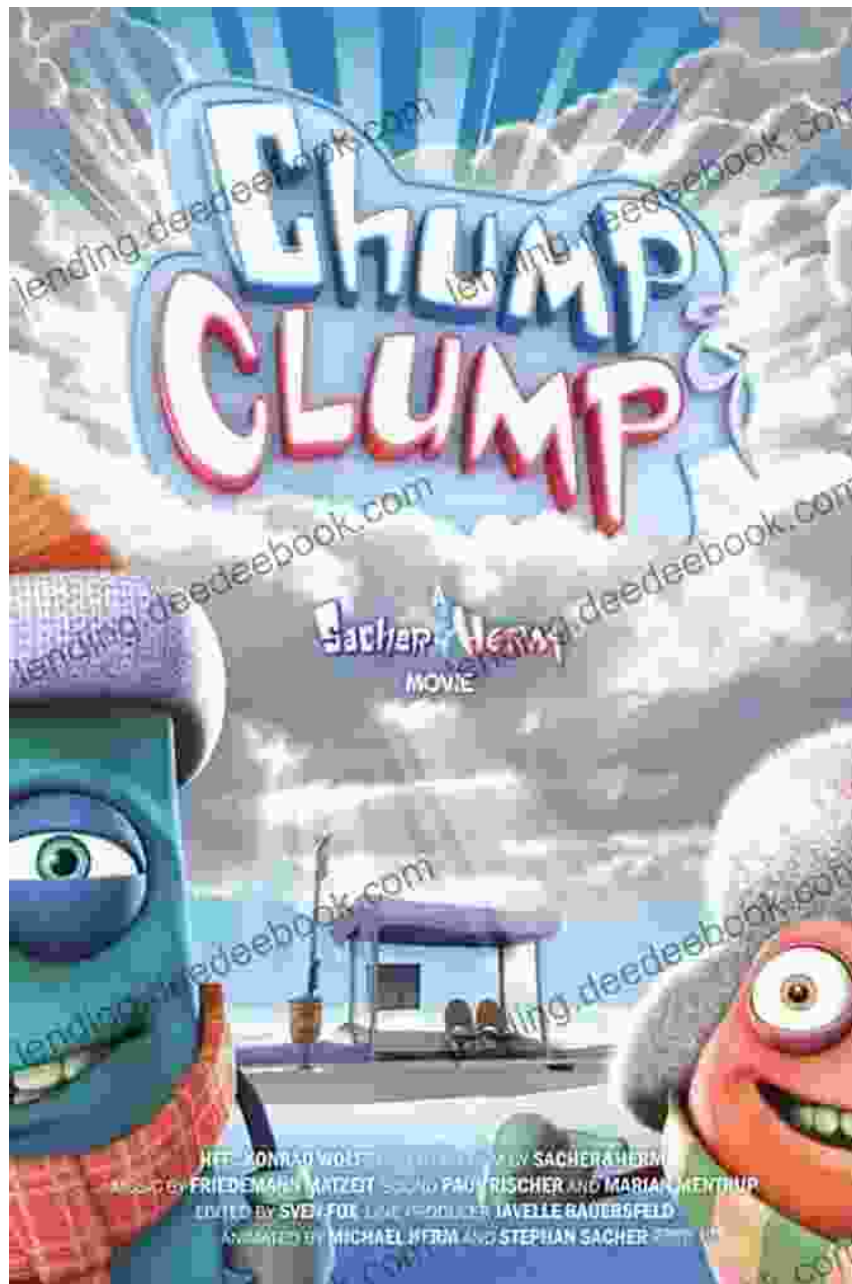
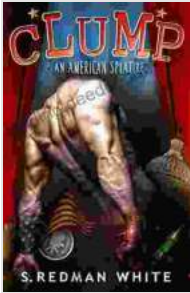


Clump: An American Splatter Classic

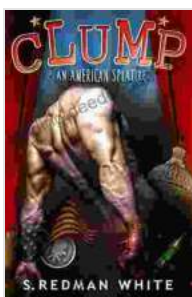

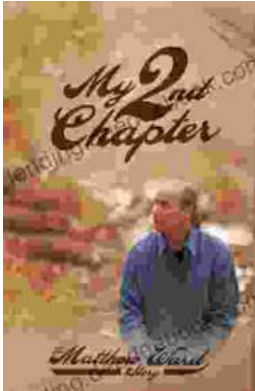

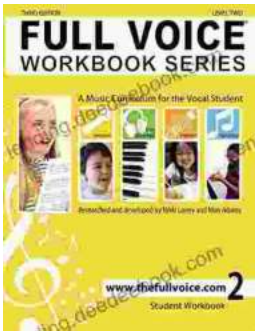
