The size of the hook you use will also depend on the type of yarn you choose. A smaller hook will create a tighter stitch, while a larger hook will create a looser stitch. For most worsted weight yarns, a size H or I hook is a good choice.

Instructions

Back Panel

- 1. Chain 50.
- 2. Single crochet in the second chain from the hook and in each stitch across. (49 stitches)
- 3. Repeat Row 2 until the back panel measures 20 inches from the foundation chain.
- 4. Fasten off the yarn and weave in the ends.

Front Panel

1. Chain 50.

- 2. Single crochet in the second chain from the hook and in each stitch across. (49 stitches)
- 3. Repeat Row 2 until the front panel measures 20 inches from the foundation chain.
- 4. Fasten off the yarn and weave in the ends.

Sleeves

- 1. Chain 30.
- 2. Single crochet in the second chain from the hook and in each stitch across. (29 stitches)
- 3. Repeat Row 2 until the sleeve measures 18 inches from the foundation chain.
- 4. Fasten off the yarn and weave in the ends.
- 5. Repeat Steps 1-4 to make the second sleeve.

Assembly

- 1. With the right sides together, sew the shoulders of the back and front panels together.
- 2. Sew the side seams of the back and front panels together.
- 3. Sew the sleeves to the armholes.
- 4. Fold up the bottom edge of the sweater and sew it in place.
- 5. Fold up the cuffs of the sleeves and sew them in place.

Tips for Crocheting Sweaters

- Use a stitch marker to mark the first stitch of each row. This will help you keep track of your progress and avoid making mistakes.
